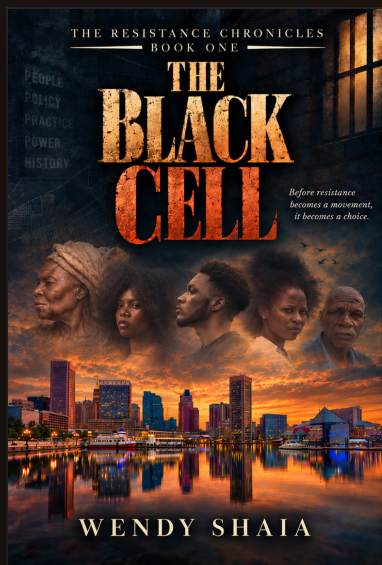

In a near-future Baltimore where racial inequity has deepened rather than disappeared, a clandestine Black resistance movement is growing. Its members have built a hidden community around a radical proposition: Black people should no longer have to negotiate for their humanity within systems designed to deny it.

But resistance carries consequences. As the movement grows, its members must navigate surveillance, betrayal, competing visions of liberation, and the personal costs of challenging the racial order. The novel combines speculative fiction, political suspense, and deeply human storytelling to explore what happens when a community stops asking an unjust system to change and begins imagining freedom on its own terms.

WHY THIS BOOK, WHY NOW

At a moment when questions about race, state power, belonging, and the limits of institutional reform remain deeply unsettled, *The Black Cell* asks readers to consider a more provocative question: What happens when Black people stop waiting for existing systems to deliver justice and begin imagining freedom on their own terms?

A NEW EDITION. A LARGER STORY.

First published in 2022, *The Black Cell* returns December 1, 2026 in a new Roots and Wire Press edition as Book One of The Resistance Chronicles. Book Two, *Seeds of Resistance*, reaches backward into the histories that shaped the movement's leaders before carrying their struggle forward.

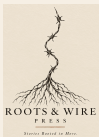
